Selecting students who will benefit most from outreach activities

KMPF provides transport funding for schools to take students to university campus locations to take part in outreach activities. In order to qualify for this funding, at least two-thirds of students taking part in the activity on campus need to be part of the KMPF Cohort.

The KMPF cohort is made up of students matching any of the below criteria:

- Has no parental experience of higher education - determined by completing KMPF baselines, baselines can be found at: www.kmpf.org/go/baselines
- Has self-declared a disability on a KMPF baseline
- Lives in a neighbourhood with a low progression rate to higher education, based on postcode – determined by completing KMPF baselines
- Has three out of four, or four out of four indicators of deprivation, based on postcode – determined by completing KMPF baselines
- Faces other barriers to progressing to higher education, such as being in care or a young carer
